Our Training Programs at the UN addresses the following **Goal 4 Targets**:

- **4.4.** By 2030, substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship
- **4.7** By 2030, ensure that all learners acquire the knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including, among others, through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development.

By the end of a weekly training, our students will have had the opportunity to:


- Acquire a deeper understanding of UN institutions and multilateral diplomacy

PROGRAM COMPONENT

Each progrmam centers on a theme, which includes Peace and Security, Sustainable Development, Global Governance, The Environment, or information on how to build a career within the UN system and international organizations.

SAMPLE YOUTH DELEGATION STATEMENT

Chinese Youth Global Competency Training Program at the UN Outcome Document Summary

1. INTRODUCTION

We, the youth representatives of China, have gather at the United Nations headquarters in New York for the Chinese Youth Global Competency Training Program at the United Nations conducted by the World Federation of United Nations Associations, to reprehend the sustainable development goals(SDS) and to call upon the international society and Chinese civil societies pertaining to Goal 4, 11 and 16.

2. A CALL TO ACTION FOR GLOBAL AND CHINESE CIVIL SOCIETY.

Goal 4: quality education

First, active knowledge sharing by and between the G7 countries by expanding teacher exchanges worldwide, and promoting materials sharing platforms, with a focus on arts, music, and physical education.

Second, increase transparency in public education by empowering teachers union monitoring

Third, enhance global teacher training and instituting service-based learning modules.

Goal 11: sustainable cities and communities

First, establish specialized departments and support CSOs to assist local governments to boost reginal competitiveness by strategical finding linkages with larger cities and educational and training specialized human capital.

Second, upgrade slums by training slum dwellers the importance of clean water supply and sewerage for their health and well-being

Third, utilize non-rusting and lean pipe structures to provide affordable and sustainable water supply and sewerage for slum concentrated areas.

Goal: Peace, justice, and strong institutions

First, raise vigilance for sex trafficking through the wide dissemination of awareness raising materials, such as that on UNICEF USA's end trafficking project.

Second, decriminalize child trafficked victims and provider shelter for runaway adolescents through the cooperation of faith-based organizations.

3. CONCLUSION

In accordance with the "Universal equality in dignity and rights" principle of the UN Sustainable Developments Goals, we, the youth at the UN, acknowledge that promoting the fundamental aspects that determine the quality of civil society is crucial in the endeavor towards a sustainable society. Therefore, be secure the sanctions of tangible and intangible components necessary for a universal inclusive environment. We advocate for the systematic enhancements and raised public awareness in regard to the challenges that we find in education, sustainable cities, peace and justice.

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
