The School is the largest of its kind in the UK, and boasts seventeen different disciplinary areas, plus teaching in nearly 20 languages. The School of Arts, Languages and Cultures also recently celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Manchester Confucius Institute, reaffirming the School's commitment to international engagement, and promotion of world languages, societies and cultures.

The School has articulation arrangements with a number of selective partners, which allows an opportunity for registered undergraduate students to spend two years studying in the UK, graduating with a degree from The University of Manchester and a degree from their home institution. This arrangement is known as "2+2", denoting two years in each institution, offering the benefits of studying in two educational systems.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY **REQUIREMENTS?**

Each application will be considered on its own merit. Typically you are expected to have the following qualifications:

You must sit the UKVI English Language test that is recorded with a camera. A minimum IELTS Score of 7.0 must be obtained. If you achieve 6.5 with each component no less than 6.0, you could be asked to attend a pre-sessional English course to improve your language and meet the requirement in time for enrolment.

An average grade of 75 out of 100 or GPA 3.0 out of 4.0 is to be achieved in the first two years of degree study at your home institution. We will need scanned copies of your transcripts from your institution as proof of your grades.

The application deadline is set each year around early April. Please check and make sure you do not miss the deadline.



WHAT IS IT LIKE TO **STUDY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MANCHESTER?**
